Acute altered mental Any individual that is status requesting 911 or Hospital level care **Skilled Medical** State Medical Care Required **Support Shelter** 24/7 Recommended Examples:

Description: Individuals who require active monitoring, management, or intervention by a medical professions to maintain their normal level of health.**

- Patients from home requiring 24/7 skilled nursing care
- Hospice patients from home
- **Ventilator patients**
- Tracheostomy which requires frequent suctioning
- Extensive wound management
- Stable dysrhythmia monitoring/ management
- Bedridden and total care required
- Individuals who have been evaluated by a medical professional and deemed necessary for care at a medical support shelter to maintain their normal level of health

Basic Medical General Shelter Recommended Support Needed

Description: Individuals who are able to meet their daily needs either by themselves or with a caretaker, and may require some assistance from a personal care assistant.

Examples:

- Oxygen Dependent
- Self ambulating, with or without DME, including wheelchair
- Deaf/Hard of Hearing and/or blind/ low-vision, with or without assistive • devices
- Diabetes, insulin and diet controlled
- Hypertension, controlled with medication

- Respiratory illness, such as COPD
- Morbidly obese
- Pregnancy requiring bedrest
- Dialysis
- Any person that desires to stay in a general population shelter, regardless of their medical history
